



## Archaeomagnetic dating of kilns in Portugal

The first archaeomagnetic results from Portugal are reported, consisting of directional data from four Roman kilns at three separate sites (Castel de Vide, Peniche, and Siexal). The observed directions are compatible with the recently-published Spanish secular variation curve and imply that the kilns date to 50 CE (Peniche), 100 CE (Castel de Vide), and 250 CE (Seixal).
