Please consider that a time-block of 5-7 minutes is dedicated to each presentation in order to equally give visibility to all submitted works. In this regard, we invite the participants to contact the author/s separately for a more intensive and exhaustive discussion and remind you that you can comment presentation material until the end of May 2020. Further, author contacts are available on each abstract and can also be shared during the session from both authors and attendees.
