

Dear colleague participants,

The EGU is bringing activities from the General Assembly online as Sharing Geoscience Online, encouraging an active scientific exchange in a new online format. With this message, we would like to share some ideas of how we propose to organize our session.

- 1) We would like to encourage you to upload presentation materials online and participate in discussing already uploaded presentation materials. These materials can be anything that you would like to share about your abstract, as for example, a pdf, some slides, a map, an animation, or a sketch. The file should be below 50 Mb in size and in a format that works across different computer systems. - 2) We have structured the session in 2 major Themes related to Agricultural Water Management and Security (Theme 1) and Integrated Water Management and Security (Theme 2) by clustering contributions with similar features and also summarizing the profile of each Theme as you will notice in the uploaded material.
- 3) Our session is scheduled for a live, text-based chat on Wednesday, 06 May, 08:30–10:15 Vienna time.

Each theme will be moderated by 2 Chairs that will set some over-arching topics based on the abstracts and uploaded materials. We will roughly hold about 5-6 minutes per contribution so that all 16 contributions will be discussed. It may be the case however, that 2-3 contributions will be simultaneously discussed with the relevant authors and other participants may also enter the discussion. We will make sure anyways that there is an even flow of the discussion and that all contributions will be described in the timeframe of the session.
