## **Session overview**



- In this session, we invite contributions to explore diverse experiences with inter- and transdisciplinary research and practice, that is specifically applied in the mountain context. Taking mountains as complex social-ecological systems, they provide a concrete and spatially-defined contexts in which to explore how global change phenomena manifests and how it poses challenges and opportunities for communities and society in general.
- Addressing societal concerns, and finding suitable solutions with regards to associated impacts of
  global change in mountains, requires and inter- and transdisciplinary (IT-TD) approach to research
  and practice. We invite contributions based on empirical research and/or practical experience with
  IT-TD, to critically reflect on these practices in the mountains context and learn from experiences
  that explicitly address societal grand challenges such as (but not limited to) climate change
  impacts and adaptation, transformations to sustainability, disaster risk reduction, or transitions to
  low carbon economies. We welcome contributions depicting research experiences in European
  mountain regions, other mountain regions around the world, as well as contributions from Early
  Career Researchers.
- The session is led and coordinated by the Mountain Research Initiative (MRI) with expectations to be able to draw from this session as inputs for the formulation of future research agendas and coordination of research collaborations in mountain regions, worldwide.
