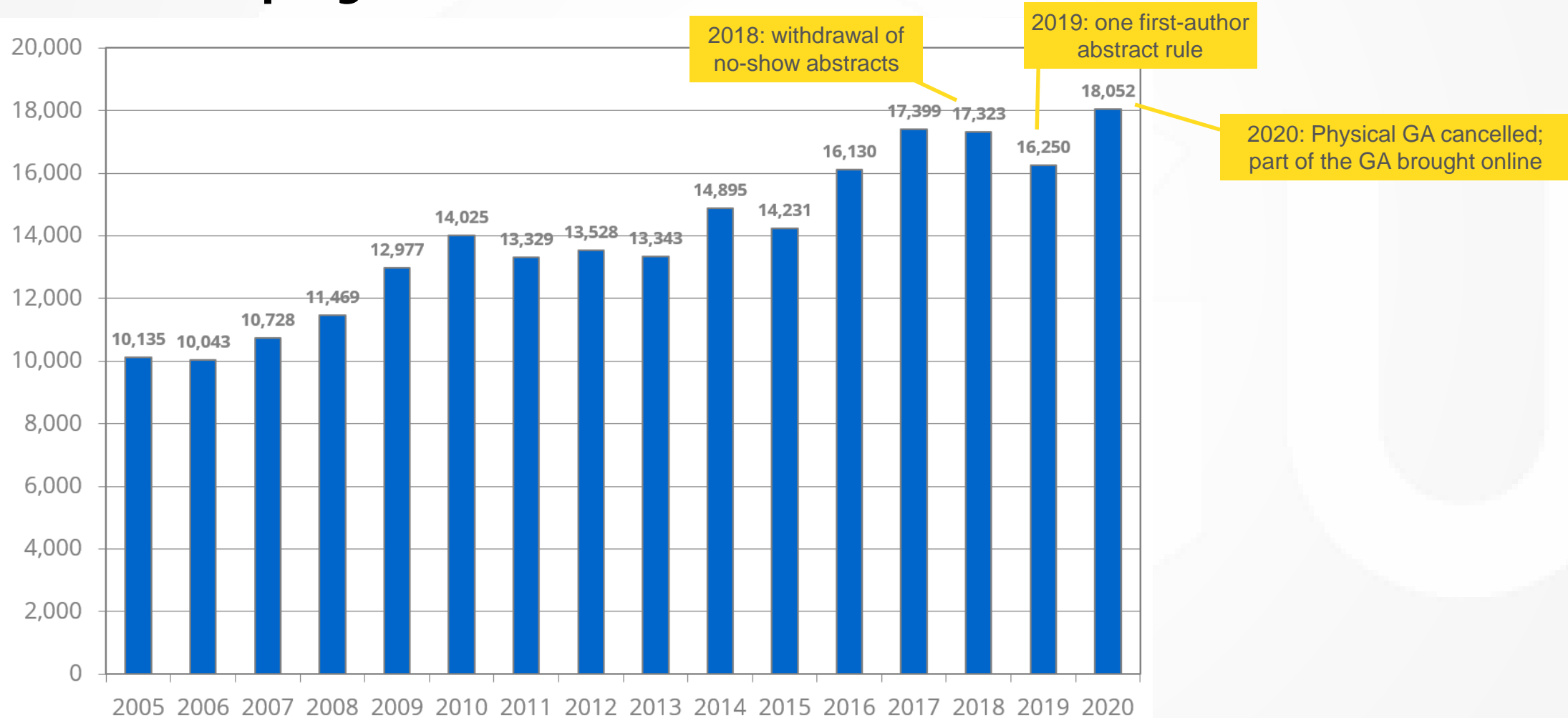

GA2020 || EGU2020 Sharing Geoscience Online: statistics (as of 27 April 2020)

- 18,052 abstracts in program +11.1% relative to 2019
(of 18,760 abstracts initially submitted)
- no distinction between Orals, Posters or PICOs → Displays
- 702 unique online scientific sessions
440 out of these 702 are co-organized (62.7%), thereof 37 ITS
- 6 online short courses
(of 88 short courses initially proposed)
- 8,616 presentation materials uploaded (as of 4 May 2020)
- 2,063 comments to uploaded presentation materials received (as of 4 May 2020)

“EGU2020 Sharing Geoscience Online”: New concept

COVID-19 = what should we do ??? Cancel or go online ?

- Go online ! Because it is EGU’s responsibility to help minimise the impact of COVID-19 on scientific research and collaboration
- Pilot experiment (please provide feedback !)

Our considerations:

- Science submitted to the GA2020 can be presented and shared
- All authors and conveners can participate, across different time zones
- Sharing Geoscience Online is accessible (in terms of bandwidth, for anyone with hearing or visual difficulties)
- The concept works for all presentation types: oral, poster and PICO

“EGU2020 Sharing Geoscience Online”: New concept

The concept of Sharing Geoscience Online allows:

- Authors to upload display presentation materials and receive feedback on (between 1 April and 31 May 2020)
- Conveners, authors and attendees to discuss abstracts, presentation materials and open questions during a live, text-based chat (between 4 and 8 May)
- Everyone to participate in Union Symposia, Great Debates, Short Courses, Networking, Division Meetings, #shareEGUart, Photo Competition, and more...
- EGU to gather experience with online activities and use this experience in plans for reducing the environmental impact of future General Assemblies
