



Climate fit – real labor ‘climate change and its impacts’ in adult education

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World Wildlife Found (WWF) and the Helmholtz climate initiative REKLIM started together a new innovative project in educational training funded by the Robert Bosch Stiftung. The project puts a focus on adult education and closes therefore a so far existing gap. The project combines the entire knowledge chain from global to regional scale and will create the basis for a sustainable and to specific needs adopted knowledge transfer by applying for the first time a blended learning format in adult education centers (Volkshochschulen) in Germany. For the global aspect of climate change and it's impact we produced a massiv open online course (mooc) with wellknown german scientists. The mooc is available in German and in English.

It develops with regional partners, scientists from REKLIM, the WWF and the regional adult education centers a training and further education opportunity about regional climate themes. It contributes to a sustainable embedding of climate change themes, adaptation and mitigation for multipliers.

The project is divided into three phases: (1) course modules prototype development in the region of south-west Germany together with the local partner's ifpro and Fesa e.V. (2) stakeholder workshop in order to prepare the next step of courses in three national German regions (3) adapt, develop and realize the roll out of the course modules with a dialogue process national wide. The presentation will demonstrate first experience within the frame of a preparatory study and how the project will be accompanied by an evaluation and social scientist research. Challenges of performing this will be discussed.
