



Background

Wikipedia is an open source, web-based encyclopedia, and allows anonymous and registered users to edit and create articles. This means that anyone can create, edit and improve articles.

However, several studies have shown the **most of Wikipedia editors are male** (See Fig. below). In addition, there are fewer and less developed articles about women, especially in STEM [1].

My experience

In May 2020, I was selected to participate in the <u>500 Women</u> <u>Scientists Wiki Scholar</u> program May-June 2020.




My initial objective was to promote and contribute to biographies of women planetary scientists. It was a surprise then to discover that the total number of planetary scientists' articles on the English Wikipedia is only 192, of which 52 women (25%). This percentage is in agreement with the percentage of women in the International Astronomical Union from all ESA's Member State (24%), which can give us an indication of the percentage of women in the field [6].

Today, Wikipedia is within the 20 most popular website [3] and every month it attracts more than 1 billion unique visitors [4].

Wikipedia can therefore give a huge contribution to change the perception the general public has about who is doing science and how a scientist looks like.



Let's organize an Edit-a-thon!



An **Edit-a-thon** (edit marathon) is an organized event where editors edit and improve a specific topic. I would like to encourage the planetary community as a whole to organize an Edit-a-thon focusing on creating content regarding **(women) planetary scientists' biographies**. This could be done both as a live or virtual event. Special attention should be devoted to minorities or underrepresented groups of people.
